FAST MAPPING	
Purpose	To help the child learn the strategy of attending to unknown words.
Objective	To expose the child to a new word and its definition. The child identifies an unknown target word from a set of 3 words; two
	known words and one unknown word.
	The child describes the strategy for identifying the unknown target word.
Materials	Target word cardsKnown word cards
Procedures	Introduce the unit topic by saying, "We are going to be talking about Dental Health (unit topic). I have some new words about Dental Health (unit topic). Let's see if you can figure out which picture matches the new word."
	Put a set of 3 cards in front of the child; one target word and two known words.
	Ask, "Which one is the dentist (target word)?"
	If the child selects the right word, ask, "How did you know that was the dentist? (target word)?"
	Model thinking process and affirm student's response: "You knew it wasn't a cat (known word) or a cookie (known word), so this had to be a dentist (target word). That's right, that's a dentist (target word). A dentist (target word) is a person who takes care of people's teeth (definition)."
	If the child selects the wrong word, ask "What is this? A cat (known word)? Right, that's a cat (known word) so it can't be a dentist (target word). What is this? Cookie, right, so it can't be a dentist (target word) either. So, which one is dentist (target word)? That's right, that's a dentist (target word). A dentist (target word) is a person who takes care of people's teeth (definition)."
	Repeat for each target word.
